

Trinity Talks

On March 18th, Trinity gathered to discuss the future of Trinity. There were 13 people in attendance in addition to Pastor Peter Soli and Pastor Stephanie. It began with a conversation about each person's concerns and hopes. We looked at a financial snapshot, and then discussed the financial and human resource limitations we are facing. After much discussion about how folks are feeling and the possible options, we took a survey based on a five-finger consensus vote by paper ballot. The question was "Should we begin exploring and planning for closure?" A 5 indicated that a person is in full agreement. A 4 indicated a more moderate agreement (some hesitations). A 3 indicated reluctance, but would go along. A 2 expressed some disagreement. A 1 was complete disagreement and a desire to block the action. The average of the 13 ballots came to a 3.9. At the conclusion of the meeting, the group decided to begin the process of planning for closure and to provide notice to Aurora of this intention, which was then shared at the Joint Council Meeting.

At this time there is not a date set for a vote for closure or closure itself.

The conversations and decisions will continue on April 29th after worship.
